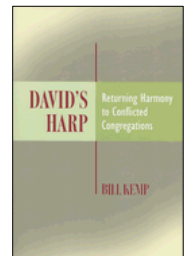


**C268.432Hal Teaching the Lord's Prayer: for Children 7 to 9 by Delia Halverson**
