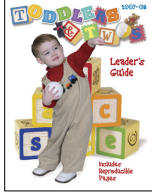

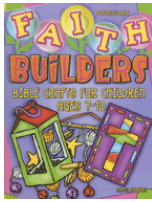
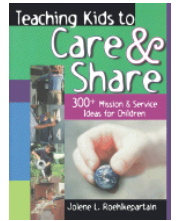

C268.432Roe Teaching Kids to Care & Share: 300+ Mission & Service Ideas for Children by Jolene

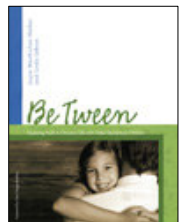

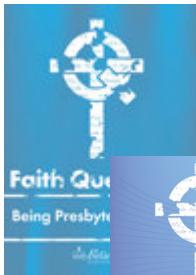
285 Wal BeTween: Exploring Faith & Christian Life with Older Elementary Children by Joyce

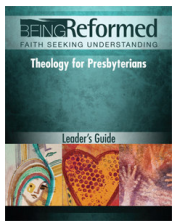
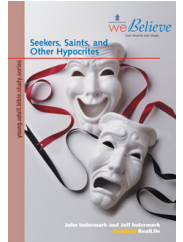


T285Pre *Salt and Light; Youth Retreat Designs—Presbyterian Youth Connection* by

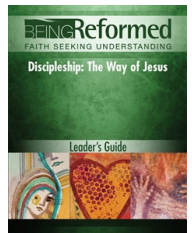
AS285Pre *Seekers, Saints, and Other Hypocrites* by John Indermark, Jeff Indermark &

PC(USA) (This title is from the *Real Faith, Real Life Series* of the *We Believe* curriculum. This series is ideal for men and women in their twenties and thirties who would like to explore life issues within the context of authentic faith. The themes in this series reflect contemporary issues facing young adults and offer questions for reflection that are rooted in Scripture and in the Reformed tradition.) Throughout the church's history, Christians have wrestled with living faithfully in a world that views the gospel and religious communities as irrelevant. The most common accusation against the church is in regard to the hypocrisy of those who live in a way that is contrary to the faith they profess. This Bible study will provide young adults with a discussion guide for issues such as the relevance of the church to everyday life; the hypocrite in me; the mystery of ultimate forgiveness; reversing the church's bad reputation and finding a way to participate in community with one's integrity intact. Through the common study of Scripture, young adults will discover how to live faithfully in the church that, with all its flaws and hypocrisy, still strives to be the body of Christ. 42 pages.



AS285McK **Theology for Presbyterians** by Donald K. McKim & PC(USA) (This is from the *Being Reformed, Faith Seeking Understanding Series*) Our Reformed tradition has emphasized the importance of knowing our theological beliefs. It has always said "theology matters." This study introduces key theological issues: The Bible, God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, the Church and the future. It focuses not only on what the Reformed and Presbyterian tradition has believed in the past but also on ways these theological understandings matter for our Christian lives in the church today. AS285McK **Discipleship: The Way of Jesus** by John P. Burgess & PC(USA) (This is from the *Being Reformed, Faith Seeking Understanding Series*) Our lives as Christians in the church can be understood as lives of "discipleship." Growing in our faith this way has many dimensions. This study focuses on the Call to Discipleship, the Problem of Discipleship, Discipleship as Identity in Christ, Pathways of Discipleship and the Fruits of Discipleship. It opens a variety of paths to understanding both the comfort and the challenge of being Christian believers who follow the way of Jesus in this world. AS285McK **Worship as Evangelism** by Linda Jo H. McKim & PC(USA) (This is from the *Being Reformed, Faith Seeking Understanding Series*) Worship is central to the life of the church. It is the core around which our identities as Christians find expression. This study examines the elements of worship as a rehearsal of salvation history, as proclamation and as centered on Word and Sacrament. It also discusses church music and surveys contemporary worship styles, including questions regarding "seekers" and how worship functions as evangelism. Participant's book is 42 pages and the leaders guide is 28 pages.

AS 285Pre *Older Adult Ministry; A Resource For Program Development* by PC(USA)

Intended for use by church leaders, both clergy and laity, this book is designed to help congregations nurture ministries *by* and *with* older adults rather than *to* and *for* them. Empowering action by and with older adults enables them to deal with issues central to their lives. This resource helps you do more than respond to the immediate needs of older adults. It shows you how to empower older people to work for the establishment of dignity, justice, and wholeness for themselves and for all people. Designed as a program tool for congregations, this manual guides you step by step through the planning and implementation of effective ministries. The first three chapters look at biblical and theological, gerontological, and ecclesiastical foundations for older adult ministries.
